

Driving to Torgon

Once in France head towards Switzerland and don't forget to drive on the right! Remember that in France the motorway signs are blue but in Switzerland the motorway signs are green.

The famous old city of Geneva is at the westerly end of Lac Lemman also known as Lake Geneva. Lausanne is a well sign posted town on the north side of the lake about 40 miles (65 km) east of Geneva. Montreux is a further 18 miles (30km) to the east and is situated almost at the end of the lake. Montreux is just 8 miles (13km) from Torgon as the crow flies.

If you are traveling from the UK it is likely that you will approach Lake Geneva from the north. Once you get near the lake it is important that you follow directions for Lausanne and Montreux and end up on the A9 motorway heading eastward in the direction of Grand St Bernard and Simplon.

Once you have passed Montreux and the lake is behind you look out for the exit for Aigle, which is a few kilometres after the Chablais services. Turn off the motorway at Aigle and at the junction take a left towards Vionnaz and continue for about 2 miles until you get to the end of the road. At this T-junction take a right then immediately left and start the climb up the mountain to Torgon.

The climb takes about 20 minutes and will take through "old" Torgon. Continue to follow the road until you see the turning to La Jorette. Take this turning and continue to "new" Torgon. At the main square bear right and drive along the bottom of the ski slope. The Gold Test Centre is the first drive on the left about 100 metres along this little road, opposite 'Les Fignards' tele-ski drag lift.
